ACADEMIC GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS

1. SCHOOL HOURS

- Students (except Kindergarten 1) must be in school **before 7.15 am**.

- **NOTE:** Students are to be out of the classroom and eat outside at the spaces provided during the break time. Students are prohibited from being in the classroom during the break time.

2. ATTENDANCE

- Students must obtain at least 85% attendance at the end of the year. Any students with attendance below 85% will not be eligible for the next academic level.
- Three times late is equivalent to one day absent. The accumulated absences will be deducted from the student's attendance at the end of the year.
- Afternoon attendance for extended lessons (regular classes) is compulsory. Absent without valid reasons or permission would result in the morning attendance to be nullified.

3. ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

A) ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

- Students must treat any programmes provided seriously, by
 - i) attending all the classes provided
 - ii) improving their subject's performance

B) EXTRA CLASSES

- Any extra classes scheduled for the students are compulsory to be attended.
- Absent students without Medical Certificate or excuse letter must inform the teacher concerned.
- Absent from extra class is equivalent to 'O' attendance for the whole day.

4. PUBLIC ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

A) PENILAIAN SEKOLAH RENDAH (PSR) – YEAR 6

- Students are encouraged to obtain 5A's or at least pass in all subjects.

B) STUDENT PROGRESS ASSESSMENT (SPE) – YEAR 8

- Students should at least obtain 70% in all core subjects and 60% in any other 4 subjects.
- Students who are keen to proceed their studies in Science stream must score 75% in all core subjects.

C) BRUNEI-CAMBRIDGE GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION 'O' LEVEL (BC-GCE 'O' LEVEL) – YEAR 11

- As a general requirement, Year 9 and Year 10 students should obtain at least 5 'O's in their examinations.
- This is because for Year 11 students to proceed their studies at 'A' Level, they must obtain at least 5 'O's in their BC-GCE 'O' Level examination, with at least a credit in Bahasa Melayu and a pass in English.
- **REGISTRAION AND PAYMENT FOR GCE 'O' LEVEL:**
 - Registration for May/June GCE 'O' Level s opens in January and it is optional.
 - Registration for October/November GCE 'O' Level opens in June and it is compulsory.
 - Registration forms will be provided to the students, which will need to be submitted back together with full payment of required fees.

Note to parents:

1. Parents are advised to monitor their children's works (classwork, homework, project and topic test) as they are included in the marking system and student's progress report.
2. Only students with Medical Certificate will be allowed to sit for an assessment/examination paper which they had missed due to illness.

6. RULES DURING ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

A) SCHOOL FEES

- Outstanding school fees must be paid at least a week before the start of any examination.
- Failure to do so may result in the student not being allowed to sit for the examination.

B) INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS

- Know the dates and times of your examinations. Attendance is compulsory. In the event of absenteeism, students must present an official medical certificate from a doctor in order to sit for the missed exam paper.
- Only clear/transparent pencil cases are allowed. Students are to bring their own writing instruments and any other equipment required for the examination.
- Carry out any instructions from the invigilators for the examination. When there is a problem, students are to raise their hand to attract teacher's attention and speak quietly. Do NOT disturb other students.
- Students must not possess any unauthorized material, including electronic devices such as smart watches/glasses, and any papers such as sticky notes. NO mirror
- All books and bags should be left in front of or back of the exam room or outside of the room. Accessing the bags during exam time is prohibited.
- Students may NOT leave the exam room without the permission of the teacher.
- Wearing of jacket is allowed inside exam room. However, jacket must be taken off and left on the desk when the student wishes to go to the toilet.
- No question paper and answer paper, even if it only contains rough work and is not part of the answer sheet, should be taken out of the exam room. All papers should be left on the desk to be collected by the teacher.
- NO eating and drinking. Only plain water bottle with no plastic cover is allowed.

6. RULES DURING ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

C) RULES FOR THE USE OF ELECTRONIC CALCULATORS

- Calculator cases, instruction leaflets or instructions and formulae printed on the lid or cover of a calculator or similar materials must not be in the possession of students during the exam, or must be securely covered if they cannot be removed.
- The power supply and working condition of the calculator is the responsibility of the students. Where appropriate, the student may bring a spare set of batteries or spare calculator into the exam room.
- The calculator must be silent, with a visual display only.
- Calculators must not be borrowed from other students throughout the exam time for any reason.
- Calculators with any of the following features are prohibited:

Graphic display

Data banks

Dictionaries

Language translators

Retrieval or manipulation of text or formulae

QWERTY keyboards

Built-in symbolic algebra or manipulations

Symbolic differentiation or integration

Capability of remote communication with other machines

The use of any such calculator will be regarded as malpractice.

WARNING

- Any attempt to cheat or to disturb any other students during any assessments or examinations may lead to disqualification.

7. STUDENT'S CLASS RANKING IN INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

A) FOR YEAR 1 – 8

1. All students will be ranked in every assessment/examination.
2. If the student dropped:
 - A) only one (1) subject, he/she is still included in the rank using the number of subjects as divisor;

Example: Out of 8 subjects the student dropped 1 subject, so the divisor will be 7 in calculating average mark/grade.
 - B) two or more subjects, the student will be automatically excluded in the class rank.
3. The divisor in calculating average mark is equivalent to the maximum number of subjects (except to those students who dropped only one subject).
 - Recognition Day is usually held in school term 1 to recognize PSR and 'O' Level candidates who achieved outstanding results in their public examinations the previous year.

B) FOR YEAR 9 – 11

1. All students will be ranked in every assessment/examination.
2. All ranking will be based on the number of credits (60% and above) earned in any subject. Should there be a tie, student's General Average (GA) will be used to determine the rank.
3. Should there be no credit marks, they still will be ranked provided that their average marks is 50.00 above.

9. PARTIAL SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

C) CONFIRMATION OF PARTIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

- Class teacher will confirm the list of eligible students with the administration office.
- Eligible students will be informed by class teacher.
- Parents of eligible students are to obtain the confirmation letter and relevant form to be filled in from the school's administration office.
- At the end of the school year, students may be eligible for subsequent year's partial scholarship award if they meet the requirement as stated in section 9D below. Same procedure will take place as stated above for confirmation of the partial scholarship award.

D) REQUIREMENT FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR'S PARTIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

1. Students must achieve and maintain:

A) At least 70% in core subjects:

- Bahasa Melayu
- English Language
- Mathematics
- Science (Year 7–8)
- Combined Science (Year 9–11 Arts)
- Biology, Chemistry & Physics (Year 9–11 Science)

B) At least credits in other non-core subjects

2. Students must maintain at least 85% in attendance.

The school's code of conduct applies during regular school hours, afternoon/Friday extended/extra classes and during any school activities or events.

NOTE: PE uniform must be worn during PE and CCA activities only.

D) PRACTICAL CLASSES UNIFORM (For Science students only)

Sciences students should wear white laboratory gown/coat on top of their usual school uniform during Science Practical classes.

2. DRESS CODE AND PROPER GROOMING

- Students should also follow the following discipline:

A) HAIRCUT

- NO dyed hair.
- NO permed hair & facial hair for boys.
- Boys should have proper haircut. The hair must **not** touch ears and collar of the shirt.
- For non-Muslim girls who are not wearing tudung, hair must be tied neatly.



B) FINGERNAILS

- Students must have short and clean fingernails.
- NO nail polish and henna.



C) SHOES

- Students must wear fully black coloured shoes with full uniform.
- NO black shoes with white soles.
- Students can wear sport shoes with PE uniform.



D) OUTERWEAR (JACKET/CARDIGAN)

- Students are prohibited to wear their jacket/cardigan **within** the school premises.
- Students can **only** wear jacket/cardigan **inside** the classroom.
- Students are to remove their jacket/cardigan whenever they are outside of the classroom.
- Any jacket/cardigan to be worn in the classroom should be of plain colour with no design on it.
- NO hoodie/pullover/sweatshirt allowed at any time.





CODE OF CONDUCT

2. DRESS CODE AND PROPER GROOMING

- Students should also follow the following discipline:

E) JEWELRY AND ACCESSORIES

- Students are prohibited from wearing jewellery and other accessories.
- Students are prohibited from wearing smartwatches.



F) HAND SOCKS AND LEGGINGS

- Girls are allowed to wear white or black-coloured hand socks only, if any.
- KG girls wearing school gown are allowed to wear black-coloured leggings only, if any.
- NO jeans, sweatpants and track pants are allowed.



G) HATS OR CAPS

- No hats or caps should be worn except during outdoor school events, such as sports, outings and visits.



NOTE:

- Class and subject teacher as well as discipline committee shall observe and monitor student's dress code and proper grooming in school.
- If student's dress code or grooming violates the school's code of conduct, appropriate corrections shall be asked to make.
- If students refuse, the Principal shall notify the parents to make necessary corrections.
- Appropriate disciplinary actions shall be taken if students continue to violate the school's code of conduct.

3. ATTENDANCE IN SCHOOL

A) ATTENDANCE

- Students must obtain at least 85% attendance at the end of the year. Any students with attendance below 85% will not be eligible for the next academic level.
- Afternoons attendance for extended lessons (regular classes) is compulsory. Absent without valid reasons or permission would result in the morning attendance to be nullified.
- Students who are present throughout the school hours will be marked 'Present (/)' in his/her class attendance.

B) ABSENTEEISM

- Any absent student should produce a Medical Certificate (MC).
- If a student cannot produce a Medical Certificate, he/she must provide a note from the parents/guardians to support the absence.
- The same rules apply to any emergencies or urgent family matters. Students are required to present a Medical Certificate or an excuse letter.
- Students who are absent without valid reason will be marked 'Absent (O)' in his/her class attendance. Students who are absent with valid reason supported by Medical Certificate or an excuse letter will be marked 'Absent with Permission (P)' in his/her class attendance.

C) TARDINESS / LATES

- Students arriving to school after 7.30 am will be considered late and will be marked 'Late (L)' in his/her class attendance.
- Three (3) times late is equivalent to one (1) day absent. The accumulated absences will be deducted from the student's attendance at the end of the year.

3. ATTENDANCE IN SCHOOL

D) GOING HOME EARLY

- Students are not permitted to leave the school compound without the permission of the administration office.
- Students may leave the school early if they feel ill or sick, or due to official, urgent or emergency reasons, only if they are picked up by parents or guardians with permission from the administration office.
- Leaving the school compound without permission is considered a serious offence and will result in disciplinary action.
- Procedure for students leaving school early if they feel ill or sick:
 - i) Students inform the class or subject teacher.
 - ii) Students obtain permission from the Principal or Deputy Principal.
 - iii) Students call parents or guardians to fetch them from school.
 - iv) Parents or guardians of the students must complete 'Permission to Leave during School Hours' form at the administration office.
 - v) Students pass the completed form to class or subject teacher before leaving the school early with their parents or guardians.
- Procedure for students leaving school early if there are official, urgent or emergency reasons:
 - i) Parents or guardians of the students see Principal to inform reason of students leaving early and present the letter stating the reason thereof.
 - ii) Parents or guardians of the students must complete 'Permission to Leave during School Hours' form at the administration office.
 - iii) Students will be notified to go home early and pass the completed form to class or subject teacher before leaving the school early with their parents or guardians.
- Students who go home early will be marked 'Early (E)' in his/her class attendance.
- **NOTE:** The school discourages the parents or guardians from fetching their child during school hours, except during emergencies or for official reasons.



CODE OF CONDUCT

4. RESTRICTED ITEMS

A) BANNED ITEMS

Students are prohibited from bringing and using the following items in school grounds. Possessing these items may result in appropriate disciplinary actions.

- Electronic devices such as mobile phones, iPads/tablets, laptops, MP3 players, iPods, digital cameras, smart watches, etc.
- Cigarettes and e-cigarettes/vape
- Vaping juice
- Cosmetics
- Jewellery and accessories
- Comb with sharp ends
- Correction fluids or tape
- Cutter and scissor
- Alcoholic beverages
- Other prohibited materials deemed dangerous to cause harm to others or to vandalize the school and/or school properties.

B) MOBILE PHONES

- As per MOE Memorandum KPE/DG/BPS/C/29, mobile phones are **strictly prohibited** in the school as it may cause disruption to lessons.
- The rules below will be applied for any offenders.

1st Offence

- The phone will be confiscated and surrendered to the Discipline Master.
- Only the parents can collect the phone.
- The offending students will be warned.

2nd Offence

- The phone will be confiscated and surrendered to the Deputy Principal.
- Only the parents can collect the phone **AFTER ONE MONTH**.
- The offending students will be reprimanded.

3rd Offence

- The phone will be confiscated and surrendered to the Principal.
- Only the parents can collect the phone **AFTER THREE MONTHS**.
- The offending students will be suspended for one (1) day.

5. CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

A) DURING BREAK TIME

- Students are to be out of the classroom and may eat outside at the spaces provided during the break time.
- Class teachers will lock the classroom during the break time.
- Students are prohibited from being in the classroom during the break time.

B) DURING LUNCH TIME

- Students are not allowed to leave the school compound without the permission of the administration office.
- In the case of afternoon extended lessons or extra class, students are not allowed to go out of the school compound during the lunch time.
- Students are highly advisable to bring packed lunch or have their lunch sent at the school gate by their parent or guardian.

C) PROPER CONDUCT

The following proper conduct should be manifested by all students:

- Reading of morning prayers (do'a) before the start of the 1st period.
- Respect all people in the school, which includes school authorities, staff, teachers, parents, visitors, schoolmates and classmates.
- Maintain the cleanliness of the classroom and school compound.
- Respect school and individual properties.
- Avoid unnecessary distractions during curriculum time.
- Come to school on time.
- Obey the teachers and Student Councillors.
- Stand in attention, with pride and dignity when singing the National Anthem and school's song.
- Submit/do homework and classwork on time.
- Practice the school's Core Values (LIGHTERS).

5. CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

D) IMPROPER CONDUCT

The following are considered wrong and illegal and may result to student's disciplinary action.

- Disrespectful to school authorities, staff, teachers, parents, visitors, schoolmates and classmates.
- Littering in the school compound
- Damaging or vandalizing school properties.
- Wearing improper uniform.
- Eating and drinking inside the classroom.
- Coming to school without books and/or any writing materials.
- Smoking or vaping.
- Disruptive behaviour such as shouting, swearing, playing in class, etc.
- Bullying, intimidation, threatening, fighting, etc.
- Bringing prohibited or banned items as stated in rules 15.
- Sleeping in class.
- Using school's appliances, equipment, etc, without permission from the school authorities.
- Going to the toilet in group.

E) VANDALISM

For any vandalism or destruction of classroom and school properties, such as books, tables, chairs, etc. Consequences may include but are not limited to:

- i) Parent/guardian contacted
- ii) Payment of damages **or** replacement of damaged goods
- iii) Detention and/or suspension, if action persists.

F) BULLYING/HARASSMENT

The school strives to provide a positive and conducive learning and working environment for students and teachers.

Any bullying, harassment, intimidation, hazing or menacing by students, staff, or third parties is strictly prohibited and shall not be tolerated. If found, appropriate disciplinary actions will be taken.
